

Dear Church Family,

As I enter into my ninth year of being a Pastor (and eleventh year of working within churches), I have been reflecting on the changes I have seen even in this short time. One of the biggest changes, and one that I feel is increasingly harmful to people's spiritual and emotional well-being, is the amount of folks not having funerals or memorial services for the ones they love that have passed.

Our society has a very tenuous relationship with death. We have removed it as far as we can: few people die in homes, they pass in hospital rooms; we no longer have the wake at home, but have a visitation in the funeral home if there is one; many people do not experience death until nearly adulthood. This is odd considering that each and every person will eventually die.

Our society and our faith has a structure for communally grieving, the funeral. The funeral, or celebration of life, or Service of Death and Resurrection (as the United Methodist Book of Worship calls it), is one of the few times we gather as a community to share in our grief and so offer comfort to each other. As Jesus says in his Sermon on the Mount, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. (Matthew 5:4)"

I understand why some people tell their family they do not want a funeral, they do not like being the center of attention, they don't want to burden the family, they think it will help them no be as sad... BUT this is highly misguided. Because without a funeral, many families feel a lack of closure. Even whole communities can feel a lack of closure. And then if the family has a funeral anyway, there can be feelings of guilt that they ignored the person's wishes.

Funerals are NOT for the one who has passed. They are for the family, the friends, the community. The best thing you can do for your family is help plan your funeral while you are still alive! Let them know what hymns you like, what scriptures are meaningful for you, contact the funeral home and pre-arrange your service, so your family can focus on grieving your death and celebrating your life, instead of funeral details.

Please do not guilt your family beyond the grave.

You are a beloved child of God, your life deserves to be celebrated, your death deserves to be mourned, and your family deserves the hope and promise of life with you, and with Jesus, eternally.
